Christmas may be a little different this year but the BCA is still planning to go ahead with its Christmas Festival. The date is now Friday 11 December and both Father Christmas and Barnes' festive White Rabbit will be joining us. We look forward to seeing most of our local shops staying open until late and hope you will support them as much as possible with your Christmas shopping. We hope to have local choirs and music groups performing through Barnes and the BCA will set up a new festive bar outside Rose House. We encourage everyone to wear masks – festive or otherwise – all evening and to respect social distancing. The event will end at 8pm. 
Pay & display




The Tell-Me Tree

Barnes Bridge Green Walkway

We won a grant earlier this year for a feasibility study of our ambitions to deliver a green walkway at the long-redundant original Barnes Bridge. This study will enable us to understand whether we can reinstate access to the original bridge at both sides of the river, providing much-needed step-free access at the same time on the Barnes side. If this project is successful, it will offer a unique attraction in Barnes unavailable anywhere else in London and will doubtlessly support our economy in the challenging times ahead.





New maps for Barnes

A new visitors' map is set to hit Barnes! Funded by the Council's Civic Pride Fund, the maps will be placed at five strategic locations across the village, at points where visitors arrive. The bespoke artwork has been drawn by an artist who is a regular at the BCA Barnes Fair, Holly Francesca. We hope you like it as much as we do.

You may have noticed that the 'Swans Crossing' sign on the road island near the BCA has been missing for a while now. The original sign was rotten and the temporary replacement far too luminous for the village. So we partnered with local artisans who designed and produced a new sign for us which we think will fit well with the character of our village. We hope you agree...



New businesses come to Barnes

These are challenging times for retailers across the country. Barnes businesses have had the added blow of the closure of Hammersmith Bridge - and yet we seem to be faring better than other high streets: in fact, we are seeing new businesses arriving here; welcoming Caroline Bloomfield and SW Ski to the High Street; a new independent at the Jigsaw site; and Maverick men's grooming have moved into the former Castelnau Tiles space. There may also be a new tenant moving into the Tree House after many years of closure. Up by Hammersmith Bridge, a new Georgian restaurant, Samaia, is well worth a visit - trade continues to be very challenging for all the businesses in this area given the huge drop in footfall - so do please support them if you can.

Barnes High Street improvements

We have been campaigning to make the High Street a more attractive destination and to address the terrible congestion caused by traffic pinch points for many years. Last year we



Hammersmith Bridge SOS

A perspective on the Hammersmith Bridge crisis from Barnes resident and Hammersmith Bridge SOS team member, Nicola Horlick.

When the news about the full closure of Hammersmith Bridge broke, my neighbour Helen Pennant-Rea and I agreed that we would set up a group to campaign for its full repair – and Hammersmith Bridge SOS was born.

We set ourselves three short-term aims: to create well-lit, safe routes for school children to get home on alternative routes; to improve the 533 bus service; and to get a temporary ferry service up and running. With the help of two organised rallies, national press, and even an article in the New York Times, we have had some success: Richmond Council have promised marshals between Putney and Queen



Elizabeth Walk – but Dukes Meadows remains unlit; and TfL has increased the number of 533 services from two to five at peak times. TfL is now in charge of procurement for a ferry but a service is unlikely to operate before the spring.

With an estimated £163m rebuild bill, neither Hammersmith & Fulham council nor TfL appear to have the necessary funds and no funding has been pledged by the government. So, we must continue to make our voices heard about the issue to mend the broken bridge in the heart of Europe's largest city.

won a grant of £100,000 and we have been working with council officers and local ward councillors to shape the best proposals to deliver a more pleasant and functional High Street for everyone - including the creation of a new eastbound bus stop and the widening of pavements. Thank you to everyone who contributed to our recent website consultation - we are waiting for the initial results and then there will be a further consultation in the spring. We really hope we can make the new plans a reality for the benefit of everyone in Barnes.

Update

Work is due to begin on Hammersmith Bridge in 2021. Procurement for a ferry service has begun and is set to start in the new year, government officials have said.
